## ROD AND REEL COMBOS

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| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ 1 Ultra Light 5'-6' with 4-6lb test line</li> <li>✓ 1 Light-Medium 5'-6' with 8-12lb test line</li> <li>✓ 1 Fly rod</li> </ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Walleye</li> <li>✓ Pike and deeper trolling</li> <li>✓ If available</li> </ul> |
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Extra reel & line is a smart idea. Pack rods properly for transportation. Vehicles eat rod tips.

## FOR WALLEYE... WHAT WORKS!! Minnows and night crawlers are important!!!

J i G S	<b>Floating Jigs</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ 1/16 oz lead head jigs with 2" rubber tails</li> <li>✓ 1/8 oz lead head jigs with 3" rubber tails</li> <li>✓ 1/4 oz lead head jigs with 3" rubber tails</li> <li>✓ 1/2 oz lead head jigs with 3"-6" rubber tail</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ perch</li> <li>✓ #1 for walleye</li> <li>✓ little deeper</li> <li>✓ deep jigging</li> </ul>
	<b>Rubber Tails</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Main colors are <b>yellow, white, green purple black pink and orange.</b></li> <li>✓ Bring a lot of <b>split shot sinkers &amp; snap swivels</b></li> <li>✓ We recommend using a <b>spinner blade</b> in front of jig and troll to locate walleye</li> <li>✓ The best all-round lure is a <b>beetle spin</b>, which is a basic jig with a spinner blade and rubber tail. You can make these up yourself with the above mentioned combos.</li> </ul>	
	<b>For Example</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Use a <b>1/8 oz jig</b> with a <b>spinner blade</b> in front. The setup is <b>1-2 split shots 8-12" in front of a snap swivel</b>. The jig is added along with a <b>minnow</b> or a <b>night crawler</b>. <b>Troll</b> very slow along the bottom in <b>8'-14' of water</b>. You will loose a few jigs on logs, rocks, etc. But hey! <b>The walleye are on the bottom!</b> If you're not there, you will not catch any! Once you have located the active walleye, you can drop your jig to the bottom and reel up slightly. <b>Set the hook</b> once the walleye start tapping. Also try casting, letting the lure sink to the bottom and retrieving slowly. Prepare yourself for snags.</li> <li>✓ This technique is the most inexpensive method of walleye fishing. Jigs are cheaper than plugs.</li> </ul>	
	<b>Good Plugs</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Main colors are <b>black, blue and orange</b></li> <li>✓ All Lake Erie Tackle</li> <li>✓ Floaters will work (get extra sinkers)</li> <li>✓ Thin Fins (diving)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Rapalas (diving-split 3"-6")</li> <li>✓ Cordel Wally Divers or suspending Wally Divers</li> <li>* <b>Any plug that will run in 8'-16' should work.</b></li> </ul>

<p><b>PIKE...</b> What works!</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Large sucker minnows (live bait)</li> <li>✓ Johnson silver minnows</li> <li>✓ Doctor spoons Daredevils</li> <li>✓ 6"-8" Steel Leaders</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Williams Wobblers (Walleye too)</li> <li>✓ Mepps Spinners</li> <li>✓ Most bass lure work</li> <li>✓ Cordell Ripplin Redfins</li> <li>✓ Flash is great! So are weedless lures!</li> </ul>
